SHORT DESCRIPTION:

Apprenticeships are worked-based learning programmes designed around the needs of employers which lead to nationally recognised qualifications.

The City & Guilds Level 3 Diploma in Trowel Occupations is a competence based qualification designed to reflect the work of Bricklaying staff with supervisory duties across the Construction Industry. The qualification covers the practical skills and knowledge required to work in Trowel Occupations and supervisory skills in the building industry. In the Level 3 Diploma learners can choose from a bank of optional units which show their ability covering every aspect of Bricklaying, drainage, concrete and repairs, this includes setting out masonry work, building cavity walling, building solid walling, applying joint finishes and all health and safety aspects of the trade. The supervisory elements cover setting out complex work, building complex work, ordering resources, developing and maintaining working relationships and confirming methods of work.

JOB ROLE:

Job roles may include: supervisory skills, organising and setting up a site. Building of traditional block and brick buildings, masonry cladding to timber frame or concrete/steel buildings. Also have access to the optional units such as; drainage, masonry repairs, plastering.

COURSE CONTENT:

- Level 3 NVQ Diploma in Trowel Occupations Credit 150 - 161 GLH 501- 537 is underpinned
- City & Guilds Level 3 Diploma in Bricklaying Credit 57 GLH 532 (K1b)
- Communication Essential Skills Qualification at Level 2
- Application of Number Essential Skills Qualification at Level 2
- Employee Rights & Responsibilities



**ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:**

There are no entry requirements, however, there are qualifications or experience that will help learners understand the sector prior to starting, such as:

- Level 2 Diploma in Trowel Occupations.
- Work experience within the Construction industry.

COURSE ASSESSMENT / EXAMINATION:

1 day per week attendance at College together with assessments in the work place.

PROGRESSION:

There are opportunities for workers to undertake further training or assessment of competence that enables them to progress within the industry. Level 3/4 supervisory and management. There is also an option to progress to the Occupational Health and Safety qualification.
