Which level is right for me?

Entry Level / Level 1

These courses are suitable for you if you don't hold any qualifications. If you don't pass your GCSEs, or perhaps you don't get the grades you had expected, then you can make a fresh start with an Entry Level or Level 1 course.

These courses will give you a good basic understanding of the subject and successful completion will enable you to progress to the Level 2 programme or onto other courses within the College.

Level 2

If you gain four GCSEs at grade D or above, you can usually go straight onto a one-year Level 2 course.

At Level 2 you will learn a variety of practical skills that will prepare you for employment or further study. Once you have successfully completed your Level 2 programme you will be able to progress onto a Level 3 course where you will gain an in-depth knowledge of your subject.

Level 3

If you gain five or more GCSEs at grade C or above you can usually enter directly at Level 3 and follow a two-year programme. Level 3 courses are equivalent to A-levels and can be a progression route to university.

If you think that you may be interested in applying to university you should check their entry criteria to make sure that your chosen course will allow you to progress to the university of your choice.

Open to College staff, students and members of the public, the commercial salon is a real working salon where you will complete your training under the watchful eye of our qualified hairdressing lecturers.

As part of the course you will also learn reception and customer service skills to get you employment ready.

BEAUTY SALONS

Our beauty and complementary therapy learners have access to four therapy rooms all equipped with the latest industry standard equipment allowing you to learn everything from manicures, pedicures and makeup; to massage, aromatherapy, reflexology, micro-dermabrasion, waxing, galvanism and nonsurgical face-lifts.

HAIRDRESSING COURSES

Engagement Hairdressing & Beauty

- 23 weeks
- Full-time
- No formal entry requirements
- Requires a referral from Careers Wales

If you are unsure what you want to do but think you may be interested in working in a hair or beauty setting this programme is designed to give you a taste of what it would be like to work in the hair and beauty industry. This course will give you an introduction to a range of hair and beauty topics.

Traineeship Hairdressing & Beauty

Level 1 Hairdressing

- 20 weeks
- Full-time
- · No formal entry requirements
- Requires a referral from Careers Wales

This course provides progression from the Engagement programme and continues to build your skills ready for further study or employment in the hair and beauty industry.

- Two GCSEs at Grade D or above (to include English Language or First Language Welsh and Science)

During this course you will develop skills in styling men's and women's hair, colouring and dressing hair, as well as learning skills for the wider beauty industry such as nail art, hand care and presenting a professional image in the salon.

Level 2 Women's Hairdressing

Level 3 Hairdressing

- lyear
- Full-time
- · Level 1 Diploma or Level 2 Certificate in Hairdressing
- Two GCSEs at Grade D or above (to include English Language or First Language Welsh and Science)

This course will prepare you for industry and is aimed at learners hoping to become qualified stylists. During the course you will learn how to cut, perm and colour hair. You will also undertake salon reception duties, learn how to give client consultations and how to promote salon services and products.

- 1year
- Full-time
- · Level 2 NVQ or VRQ Diploma in Hairdressing
- · Relevant work experience or work placement

This course provides progression from the Level 2 Diploma and is designed to equip you with advanced skills in cutting, styling and colouring. Throughout the course you will be encouraged to show your creativity and to begin to build your own signature style.



BEAUTY COURSES

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Level 2 Beauty Therapy

- lyear
- Full-time
- · Level 1 Diploma or Level 2 Certificate in Hairdressing
- Three GCSEs at Grade D or above (to include English Language or First Language Welsh, Science and preferably Maths)

This course is designed for learners who are aspiring to work in the beauty industry. You will study a vast range of modules from manicure and pedicure to waxing, facials and make-up. Excellent organisational skills and a positive attitude are key requirements for this course.

Level 3 Beauty Therapy

- lyear
- Full-time
- · Level 2 NVQ or VRQ Diploma in Beauty Therapy
- Relevant work experience or work placement

As part of the Level 3 course you will learn advanced practical skills and theory that will equip you with a wide variety of skills. The skills and techniques learnt will provide you with access to the broadest possible range of future career options.



COURSES

Complementary Therapies Level 2

- lyear
- Part-time
- Two GCSEs at Grade D or above (to include English Language or First Language Welsh and Science)

Complementary therapies are growing in popularity in both spa and clinical settings. This course will introduce you to the principles and practice of complementary therapies and equip you with basic aromatherapy and reflexology techniques as well as giving you an understanding of the importance of healthy eating and well-being. During the course you will carry out treatments on members of the public in our realistic working environments.

Complementary Therapies Level 3

- lyear
- Part-time
- Level 2 Diploma in Complementary Therapies or Beauty Therapy (or equivalent)

This course builds on the knowledge you will have acquired at Level 2. During the course you will study six units including massage, anatomy and physiology, reflexology, aromatherapy, principles of complementary therapies and business practice. You will also continue to carry out treatments on members of the public in our realistic working environments.

Carla joined the College in September 2013 to study Level 2 Beauty Therapy, here is her story:

I had always known that I wanted to go into the beauty industry and this was only the beginning. In the course we studied different topics with practical and theory sessions - I loved them all! One of the sessions was on make-up and as soon as we started to learn about the topic my eyes were glued to my tutor Emma who held this class. Her make-up was amazing and I could see how passionate she was about it.

In the middle of the year, the beauty department held a competition on

manicures, polish, make-up and waxing! My friend Gabby and I won the competition which meant we got to compete in WorldSkills in Birmingham.

The experience of competing at WorldSkills was amazing. The prepping and practicing had to be done before leaving but if you ever get the chance to do it, please do! Neither of us brought home a medal from the competition but it was a fantastic experience. I had loved my first year of college so much and made so many friends!

Once I finished College I had to think about my career. I was looking online for jobs and saw Debenhams was recruiting

for someone to work part-time on the Benefit Cosmetics counter (at the time I loved Benefit make-up!). I got through to interview and within four weeks I had already had training and was ready to start my job on the make-up counter.

Meeting new customers and making people feel good about themselves and bringing out their confidence makes me love my job more and more each day.

Working on a make-up counter isn't all about doing make-up, we have sales targets and paperwork so it's not as easy as it looks, but when you love your job so much going into work doesn't even feel like work!

Make-up is like an art that is never ending. You can get so creative with it.

PAULINE HUI: COSMETIC SCIENTIST, GOOD HOUSEKEEPING MAC



After leaving Pembrokeshire College in 2003, I enrolled on the BSc in Cosmetic Science at the London College of Fashion. After graduating I got a job in the Technical Centre at Boots Head Office where I worked in the formulation team mixing together ingredients to make products such as lipsticks, foundation and day creams.

I then moved to Unilever whose brands include TRESemmé, Tigi, Toni & Guy and Dove. Whilst here I did hair care consumer testing as well as working with hair stylists to test the performance of the hair care formulations; we had to

After leaving Pembrokeshire College in make sure that the products performed characteristics, market trends, what are 2003, I enrolled on the BSc in Cosmetic well before they went on sale. the shower facilities like in Saudi Arabia,

I also did training videos about understanding the sensory properties of hair care, e.g. the sounds, smell, look and feel of hair and hair care products. For example, if you spray a hair spray, you listen to the sound of it, does it sound like it would be firm hold or soft hold? It's all subconscious but very important for brands to get this right.

During my time at Unilever I created an App and wrote fact books about global consumers covering things like hair

characteristics, market trends, what are the shower facilities like in Saudi Arabia, what's the climate in US etc, I wrote books about 17 countries and this is what made me realise I wanted to go into journalism.

I now work at Good Housekeeping magazine as Beauty Testing Manager. This role means that I need to understand the beauty trends and conduct testing on any beauty features we have in the pipeline. It involves testing with our expert and consumer panels to deliver content across our editorial, digital and commercial platforms. Whilst at Boots I formulated lots of products including creating products for No7. I was super proud of this seeing my products on the shelves!
