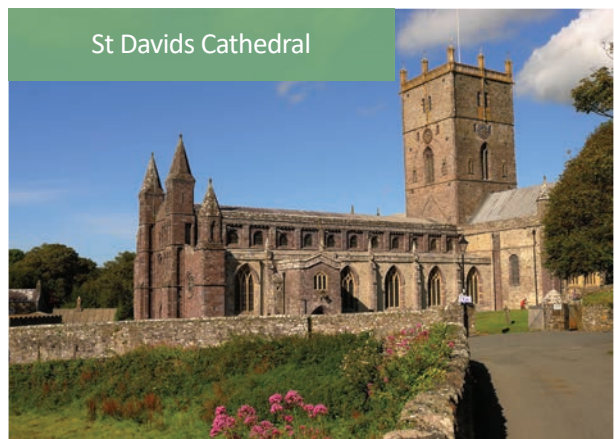

ll learners have access to communal spaces including the Study Centre for individual and group study as well as a space for silent study. This area is well equipped with computers, books and journals to help learners to get the most out of their studies.

Learners also have access to a large canteen, a convenience store and a coffee shop as well as the atrium which forms the heart of the College.

A-level learners have access to IT suites and modern laboratories while our vocational diploma students have access to a vast array of facilities including: Mac suites; marine, electrical and mechanical workshops; recording studios; dance and performance spaces; screen printing workshops; virtual patients and virtual babies; robots and drone technology.

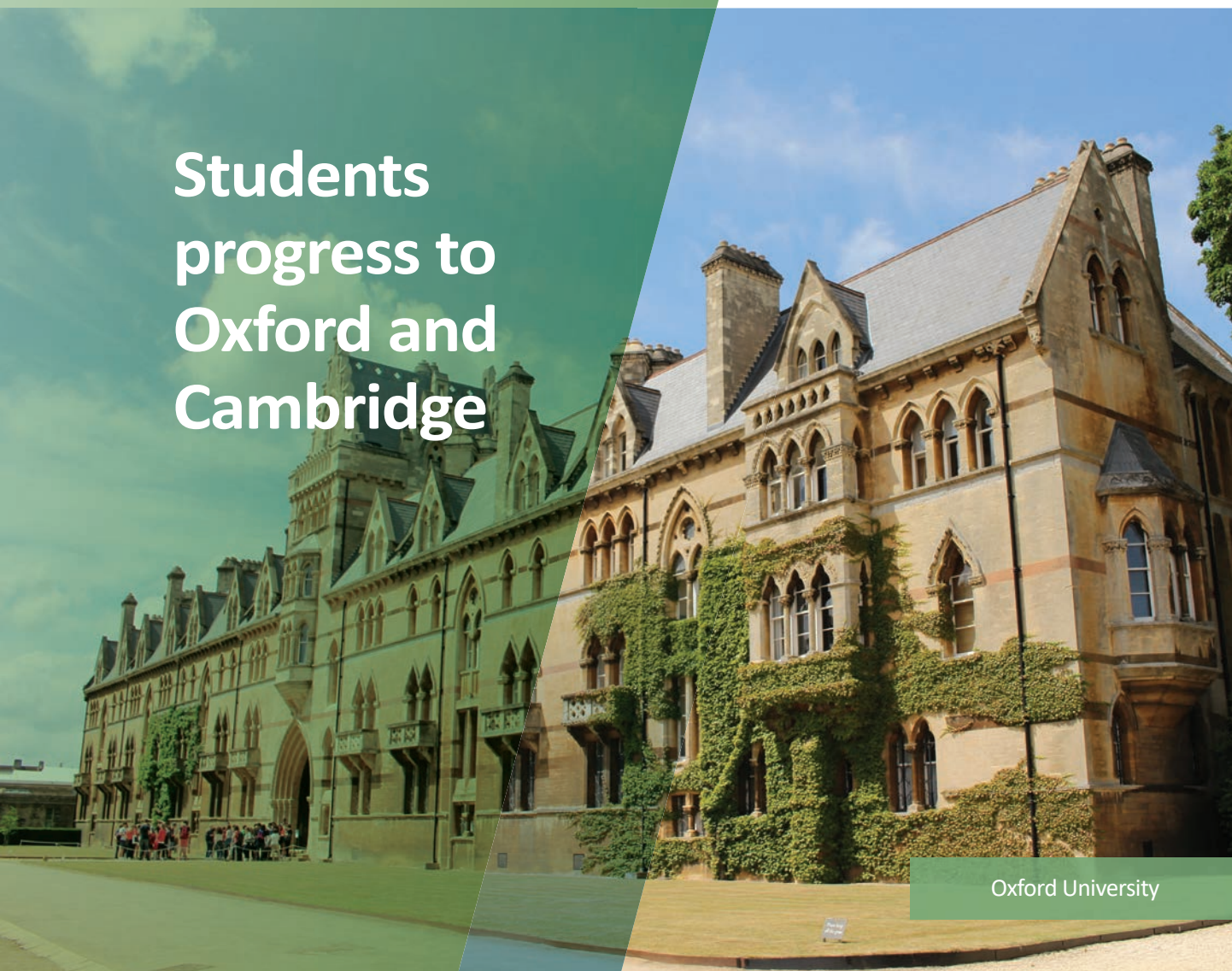

We employ teaching staff who have specialist academic post-16 qualifications and real industry expertise. This combination ensures that you receive high quality teaching that is both engaging and stimulating guaranteeing you the best possible start at advanced level.



PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

Students can choose three or four A-levels (depending on their ability and aspirations).

- All students must attend the essential studies qualifications (ESQ) over two years.
- Students will be expected to attend all periods and group tuitions.



ENTRY REQUIREMENTS*

Students wishing to study A-levels will be required to gain a minimum of 5 GCSE's/IGCSE's at grades A-C to include English, Mathematics and/or Science, dependent on the subjects chosen. Additionally, students will normally be required to have a minimum GCSE/IGCSE grade B in the subject or related subject being studied at A-level. Entry grades for Psychology require a grade B in Mathematics and English.

Why choose to study a vocational diploma?

Level 3 Vocational Diplomas are equivalent to three A-levels. They are more practical in their design and focus generally on a specific pathway e.g. Health or Engineering. Many learners, dependant on what and where they would like to study, will sometimes take an A-level subject alongside their Diploma.

A vocational diploma programme consists of the following:

Students can choose only one Vocational Diploma subject but may be able to choose to study an A-level alongside it (e.g. Engineering or Computing Diploma students may find it useful to also study A-level Maths depending on their ability and aspirations).

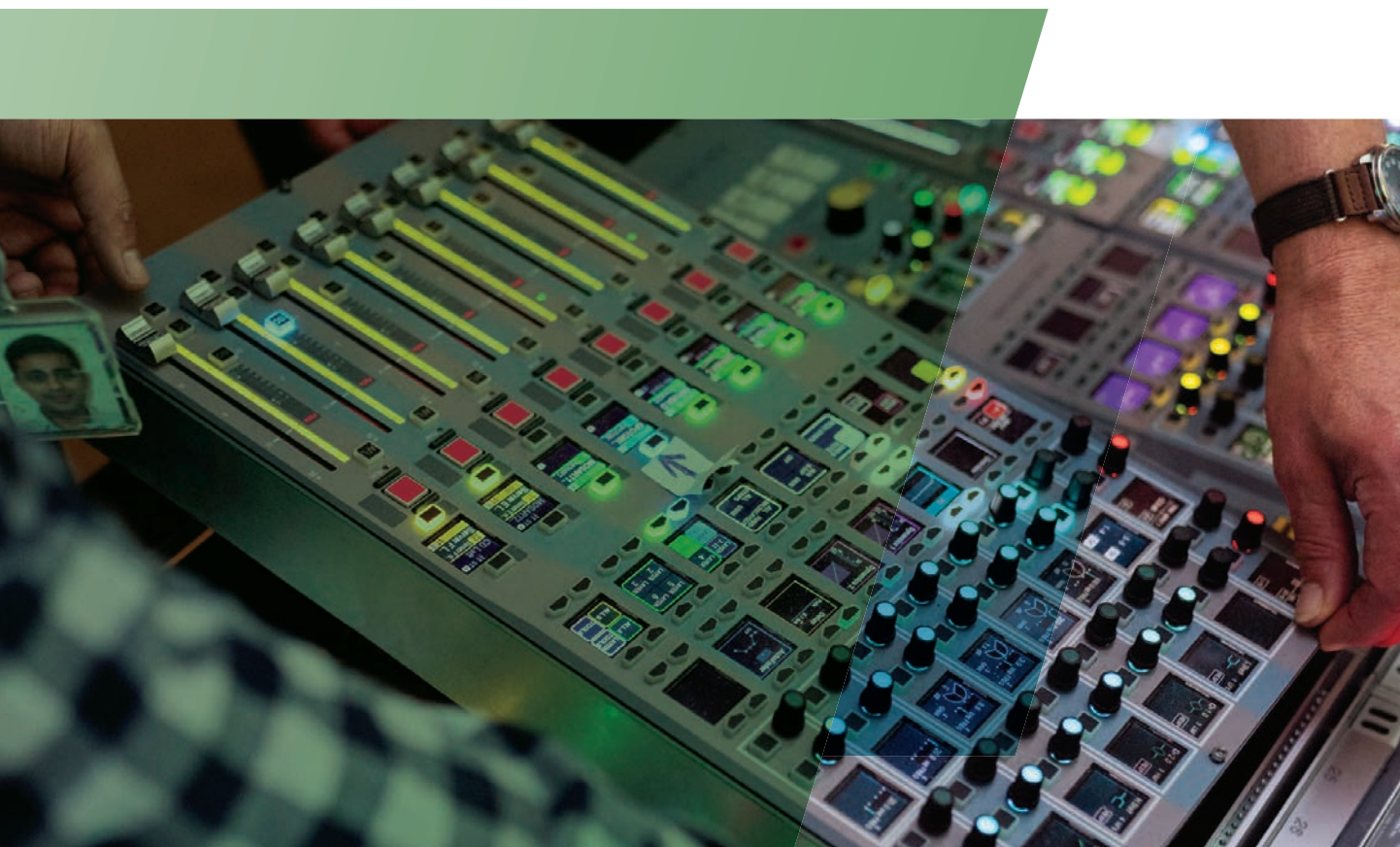
- All students must attend the essential studies qualifications (ESQ) over two years.

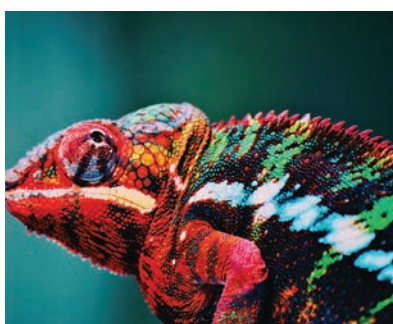
Vocational diplomas

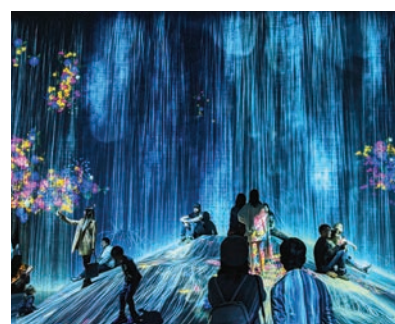
Applied Science

Animal Management

Creative Arts

International academic student support (IASS)

For international students our International Academic Student Support programme is an optional extra which offers a complete and thorough level of support; including specialist university application support, careers advice, work experience guidance, extra tuition hours per subject and more.

Investing In Your Potential

We have developed our International Academic Student Support (IASS) programme to help deliver the best possible study programme whilst maximising resources and time.

The programme is an optional extra and adds to the level of support that will allow international students to achieve their full potential during their time at the College.

As part of the IASS programme students will receive:

- One extra hour per A-level subject, increasing the time per subject from a standard five hours per week to six hours per week. This extra hour will act as a subject specific tutorial that will allow students to work through additional problems or revisit past topics depending on the need.
- Ad-hoc one-to-one tutorials as and when required and where possible for subjects.
- Four hours of English Language Support, split into two general English hours designed to help students improve English Language Proficiency and achieve the desired score for progression into university. The second two hours are subject specific, teaching students' English language skills to guide them through the language pitfalls of their subjects.
- Supervised study sessions to ensure students are keeping on top of their home/independent work. We will also take the opportunity to gather any feedback and speak about issues with students during these sessions.
- As an international student, you will also be given access to our More Able and Talented (MAT) mentoring system for university application preparation, this is usually reserved for high achievers but will be provided to all international students.

More Able & Talented Students (MAT)

All international students receive UCAS (University & Colleges Application Service) support. A panel of senior academics has been selected to help students develop areas of excellence through specialist guidance and mentoring.


Students aspiring to study medical pathways will receive mentoring from Maxine Thomas, Head of Safeguarding and Learner Services at Pembrokeshire College and Dr. Vellupillai Vipulendran, an advisor to the College. As part of the mentoring sessions students will receive admissions test preparation such as:

- Preparation for UCAT (UK Clinical Aptitude Test)
- Preparation for BMAT (Biomedical Admissions Test)
- Preparation for STEP (Used by Cambridge University as the basis for conditional offers)

Pembrokeshire College is a member of a network of partnership hubs called the SEREN HUBS. The hubs were created to enable schools and colleges to share resources with a means to preparing students for universities like Oxford and Cambridge.

- mock interviews with an Oxbridge consultant
- attendance at Vet Med & Medlink conferences
- SEREN network activities
- an event for Russell Group & Oxbridge
- events at the Liberty Stadium (home to Swansea City)

We're committed to helping you to achieve

Hours of study

Students receive 15-20 lecturing hours during the College week (depending on the number of subjects studied) with the remaining hours used for directed and independent study. Students regularly use the Study Centre to work on research projects and assignments, which is a good pre-cursor to university style learning.

All classes take place between 9am and 4pm, Monday to Friday.

Helping you to succeed

The College has invested in a pastoral system to ensure successful completion. This includes Personal Tutors and Learning Coaches. Study Skills Advisors are also on hand to help with assignment planning and proof-reading - all of which ensure that students remain focused and motivated to achieve their qualifications. Students receive an hourly group tutorial as well as scheduled personal tutorials.

Progress and reports

All students receive an electronic Learner Profile, which is available online and can be accessed remotely by parents. Progress is monitored regularly and Learner Profiles updated accordingly. Parents can arrange Skype meetings at any time during the year to discuss progress with the student's personal tutor.

Our Boarding Package

A blended package that incorporates the independence and local integration of Homestay accommodation and the added support of a boarding environment.

The boarding plus setting is accommodation available to international students during term time, half terms and the Easter holidays. All accommodation is arranged via Pembrokeshire College.

- A fully catered service of combined meals at the students' accommodation and at the College. A combination of lunch at the College and two meals at the accommodation on a week day and three meals on weekends and holidays at the homestay provider.
- Only one student is placed with each homestay provider. Students are provided with their own room, towels, bedding, study space and access to laundry facilities.
- We aim to provide a safe and supported transition into living in the UK starting with the airport pick-up on designated days at the start of the academic year.
- Access to our fully equipped fitness centre seven days a week.
- Our homestay providers are located across Pembrokeshire. If your homestay is more than a short walk to the College you will be provided with a free bus pass to allow you to access College transport which will bring you to and from the College each day. Depending on your location, journeys can be up to 30 minutes.
- Boarding Plus also includes enrichment activities during non-teaching days that are in addition to the general activities that are available to all students. We also encourage students to explore the beautiful Pembrokeshire Coastline as well as the rest of the UK.

The safeguarding of learners is a major priority for the College. The provision of safe and effective care as well as protection is of high importance.

24-7-14

We operate a 24-7-14 procedure for our applications meaning the whole application process, up until our issuance of a conditional offer letter, will be dealt within 14 days of your initial enquiry.

Note: Students should obtain International Student Insurance prior to arrival at the College. The College encourages students arriving in the UK who are under 18 to have an appointed Guardian. The minimum age for students applying to study at Pembrokeshire College is 16.



Fees

We aim to provide our students with a complete package meaning that from the moment you arrive in the UK, other than your own personal expenditure, studying with us will cost you no more than what we have already advised you that you will pay.

** Weekday provision is covered by breakfast and dinner provided by the homestay provider with lunch provided at the College’s fine dining restaurant. On weekends three meals each day are provided by the homestay provider.

Designated Airports are London Heathrow and Cardiff International Airports. Your pre-arrival pack will contain information on the exact dates and times.

Two designated activities a term are covered in the boarding cost to encourage students to integrate and allow them to experience the United Kingdom. Students are welcome to join in on any event that is suitable for them, however not all events are covered in this fee. Your pre-arrival pack will contain more information on this.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

We require all applicants to have completed secondary school to a good level of attainment. If secondary education in your country ends at the age of 18 then we will expect you to have studied in high school up to the age 16 before commencing your studies at our College.

To consider your application, we will require to see stamped copies of your last two years’ school reports. An offer for a place to study will be made at the College’s discretion following consideration of the application including your previous school reports.

Please check the website for full entry criteria www.pembrokeshire.ac.uk

Note: as a Tier 4 sponsor, should you require a visa, we will issue you with a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS), only when we are satisfied with your application for study.

International students are expected to have completed Academic IELTS with an overall score of 5.5 (with a minimum of 5.0 in each component). If you require a visa your English Language Proficiency qualification should meet UKVI’s requirements.
